



# Standard 9: Domestic Abuse

# Aims

- To improve identification of people experiencing Domestic Abuse within GP practices in Ealing.
- To ensure safety of the victims identified (including their dependents children and elderly)
- To ensure victims identified are referred effectively for the provision of on-going advice, information and support.
- To increase public awareness and help break down any stigma.

# Standard 9: Domestic Abuse

Key Performance Indicators (KPIs)


The provider is required to meet the below Key Performance Indicators:

- 1. Assign 1 or 2 clinical 'Domestic Abuse Champion(s)'. Clinical team to complete training on Domestic Abuse and safeguarding (adults and children)
- 2. Practice to run baseline search audit of 'history of domestic abuse' register and provide data on:
- The number of newly diagnosed people experiencing Domestic Abuse (adults and children)
- The number of victims referred to local Domestic Abuse support services (or declined)
- 3. Promote your practice as a 'domestic abuse awareness practice'

## **Domestic Abuse 2023/24: History**

Show Incomplete Fields

If the patient (and any children / vulnerable adults) are in immediate danger dial 999 and initiate child protection / adult safeguarding procedures. Be extra vigilant during remote consultations as perpetrator may be around. Ensure confidentiality, unless safety is questioned.

ALL information in the EMR (Electronic Medical Record) about domestic abuse MUST be hidden from patient online access.
