We work closely with the NHS London Sustainability Network, NHS London Procurement Partnership, Primary Care Anchor Network, GLA London Anchor Institution Network, and the five London Integrated Care Systems.

Scaling the London Living Wage

7,273 staff have received pay rises to the London Living Wage – 23 Trusts accredited

Primary care desk-based job review - Less than one in four (22%) of the total adverts reviewed had a starting salary at or above the London Living Wage, meaning 78% of the adverts did not.

VCS Group Workforce Project

Directly funding 7 organisations embedded into our local communities in NCL

The organisations will promote of careers in Health and Social Care to the local population

Aims to support 100 residents to take part in a pre-employment course, provide employability support and job matching for entry level roles in the sector

DWP & JCP UPSKILLING PROJECT

- Project scoped to design and deliver training to upskill JCP Work Coaches on careers in Health and Social Care and the PCAN / Academy opportunities in NCL
- Through the training aim to increase the JCP Work Coaches confidence in referring residents into the Academy / PCAN offers
- We will upskill nominated JCP Work Coaches to become Health and Social Care Champions
- Delivering the training at 10 sites in the most deprived areas of NCL
- Delivery due to take place between Nov Dec 2023

HEALTH AND SOCIAL CARE CAREERS FAIR

- NCL Training Hub has ongoing partnership with Middlesex University to deliver a yearly Health and Social Care Careers Fair
- The fair in 2023 was our biggest fair to date 381 attendees and 90+ exhibitors from a range of professions across H&SC
- Provided opportunity for young people to speak directly to health care professionals
- For the first time this year we opened up attendance to NCL residents

NCL HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE ACADEMY PARTNERSHIP

- An integrated Health and Social Care Academy hosted at Camden Council has been established, under the North London Council Team
- Partnership with the PCAN Project Manager and Academy leads
 coordinated approach to both programmes in NCL and joint delivery on a number of projects
- Primary Care resource within the Academy project team ensuring a primary care focus in the Academy work and support aims to increase recruitment of residents into entry level roles in primary care

Aim: To identify and support North Central London residents who are unemployed, underemployed or that have barriers into employment by directly funding VCS groups in NCL

The organisations aim to engage NCL residents from underrepresented groups including ethnic minorities, refugee communities, care experienced young people, women facing barriers into long term employment or in low income single adult households, and those who are experiencing or are at risk of homelessness and those living with a health condition

The VCS Group promote careers in H&SC with residents and recruit candidates for the project

What is CARE?

CARE aims to radically improve population health and reduce health inequalities by connecting and empowering the whole health and care workforce and their local communities to design and deliver services that individuals need and want.

CARE is a holistic change approach led by general practice nursing - super connectors! - supporting workforce resilience and leadership development using a combined focus on:

- System-wide engagement connecting national and local teams and strategies
- Individual activation using population health improvement projects to anchor learning and demonstrate value
- Applied leadership creating and maintaining the right environment for change and innovation

CARE's operating principles:

- Customer-led and focused on continuous improvement based on 3 phases and 3 main areas of activity Spread, Enable,
 Sustain currently anticipated to be delivered over a 3 year period.
- Draws on a variety of sources of funding to meet the needs of the programme as it evolves.
- · Enables sustainable change and innovation through local system ownership, capacity and capability













Highlights

- We are developing work experience opportunities in Waltham Forest with Trainee Nurses on rotation with Evelyn Odeyemi PCAN PM, Rey Felek

 PCN Manager, Blessing Paul-Palmer Nurse Educator Facilitator, CPV, Charlotte Stanford-Gibbs Training and Placement lead, CPV. The
 group got together to create a draft proposal 'Work Experience Structure Potential Model for Practices', using the learning from each partner,
 and using the collated work experience policies that already exist across NEL.
- We have supported the ICS Workforce team to hold a workshop with the Young Person's Panel, to get feedback on a survey aimed at learning
 about what does/doesn't attract Young People to careers in Health and Care. This is the continuation of the ICBs consultation phase. The Careers
 Project will continue to support in engaging YP over the summer, to gather feedback and use this to shape the Workforce Plan.
- The Careers Project have collaborated with Jo Barter to set up two Apprenticeship Lunch & Learn sessions. The Careers Project has advertised
 these opportunities to over 200 Careers Ambassadors in the August newsletter. The sessions aim to raise awareness about apprenticeships, so
 ambassadors can talk comfortably about them at career events. We will also create a shareable resource, which will support careers engagement.
- Ambassador drop in session continue to attract new ambassadors who are seeking support with the role, and those who want to share feedback.
