13:00 – 13:45	Greener Practice – What can GPs and GP trainees do?
10.40	<b>Dr Veena Aggarwal</b> is a GP Registrar in South West London. She completed the Chief Sustainability Officer's Clinical Fellow scheme in 2021-2022 and now chairs the Greener Practice South London group and the Greener Practice Trainee Forum. She is also the Vice Chair of the clinical Sustainability group at the Royal College of General Practitioners.
Summary	Veena has called upon healthcare professionals, doctors in this case, to use their trusted voices to amplify the case for working towards a more sustainable healthcare system. She outlined what doctors and other clinicians in primary care can do to reduce carbon emissions clinically and wider actions for change such as speaking to patients about air pollution, considering plant-based diets. Using local influences, she explained how we could encourage others to switch to renewable energy sources or bank with greener financial institutions.

14:00 – 14:45	Waste reduction of nitrous oxide gases
	Laura Stevenson is the Associate Chief Pharmacist for Aseptic Services at King's College Hospital NHS Foundation Trust, and the medicines sustainability lead for the Trust.
Summary	Laura outlined how the task and finish group was started at King's College Hospital sites to tackle huge waste of nitrous oxide through manifolds. Clinicians and non-clinical teams were engaged who worked together and significantly reduced carbon emissions relating to nitrous oxide and entonox use. The project was shortlisted for HSJ Towards Net Zero award in 2023.
