He highlights the potential to decarbonise primary care if there is a top-level overarching view of where the carbon hotspots are to manage them. Io Hui who is also Senior Consultant in Sustainability for Turner and Townsend co-presented on the inhalers decarbonisation workstream with prescribing data obtained for local integrated care systems from
