North West London Evaluation Toolkit launch 10 April, 14:15—15:00



Evaluation is essential in knowing which services, interventions and solutions have the greatest impact. Register today to hear more from the North West London Evaluation Consortium about a brand new tool to support health and care organisations to conduct more frequent and more effective evaluations.

North West London is putting a system-wide focus on a consistent, joined-up approach to evaluation, with a new four-step approach which has been codesigned across the sector. The North West London Evaluation Consortium is launching the region's Evaluation Toolkit, a new website that will support staff of all levels, across all health and care organisations in our patch to conduct more evaluations, with the collective goal of improving outcomes for our local population, patients and staff.

This 45 minute webinar to launch the new website will be chaired by Professor Bob Klaber (Director of Strategy, Research and Innovation and Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust) and Matthew Chisambi (Director, Imperial College Health Partners). The full agenda, including speakers from across North West London, will be shared shortly.

The North West London Evaluation Consortium is collaborative effort across our system; a great example of how NHS, academic and research, third sector, and innovation organisations can come together and leverage their collective strengths towards addressing a need in the system. The Consortium is comprised of the North West London Integrated Care Board, Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust, Imperial College Healthcare Trust, North West London Applied Research Collaborative, Imperial College London, Brunel University, and Third Sector Togeher (3ST).
