Call to Action on HIV in Hammersmith & Fulham

Hammersmith & Fulham has one of the highest rates of HIV in England and we are seeing a worrying spike in new diagnoses This is a trend which is not matched by the London wide data.

In 2019 H&F rate was 13.5/100,000, the London rate was 12.2/100,000 In 2023 H&F rose to 15.6/100,000 whilst the London rate dropped 11.0/100,000

In H&F, gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men (GBMSM) and residents of mixed/other ethnicity make up a larger proportion of new HIV diagnoses compared to population estimates.

Call to action from our colleagues at <u>10 Hammersmith Broadway</u> our local HIV and sexual health clinic:

"We are at risk of losing the momentum gained pre-pandemic in reaching the HIV plan for <u>zero</u> <u>HIV transmissions by 2030</u>.

We should be offering HIV testing, HIV preexposure prophylaxis (PrEP) and condoms to anyone at risk of HIV."



Late Diagnoses

A late HIV diagnosis is when someone tests positive for HIV after the virus has already caused significant damage to their immune system. In H&F, latest data show that a larger proportion of heterosexual & bisexual women first diagnosed in the UK were diagnosed late (33.3%) compared to gay,

Bisexual, men who have sex with men (GBMSM) (16.7%) & heterosexual men (16.7%).

Please reiterate the importance of sexual health screening, using condoms, accessing vaccines and PrEP for preventing HIV and STIs.

Following on from the success of opt-out HIV testing in emergency departments, we are asking GPs to consider a routine HIV test when patients are undergoing blood tests for other reasons.

Sexual Health London (SHL)

is a free online sexual health service offering full sexual health screening and contraception services. The test kits are delivered to patients' homes with no markings or logos & can also be delivered to alternative addresses. Results are delivered discreetly to the patient's mobile via text, or they can log into the portal for their results.



In H&F residents from Black, Asian and other ethnic groups are underrepresented for online testing.

Please promote SHL to patients without symptoms for STIs, HIV and Syphilis testing. The kit is shown in the photograph above.

HIV CONFIDENT

1 in 3 people say they are not comfortable discussing their HIV status with their GP.

'HIV Confident' is free for GP Practices.

By becoming HIV Confident you will benefit from being able to access training, resources and promote your HIV Confident status to patients and employees using the HIV Confident logo, providing valuable evidence of quality and standards to the Care Quality Commission.

In light of the news of the death of a British national from Rabies, your GP surgeries may experience an increase in calls from concerned patients.

The UKHSA Rabies & Immunoglobulin Service (RIgS) can be contacted to support health professionals with rabies risk assessments and provision of post exposure treatment. Please note that they can only support once the patient has returned to the UK and will need details including date/place/animal of incident, full medical history and whether they have had rabies vaccine or post exposure in the past.
