Overview: Ealing Local Enhanced Services 25/26

- Minimal or no changes to most specifications
- MSK specification removed → Replaced by new specifications:
 Alcohol Screening & Digital and Al
- Changes to Proactive Care Specification to reflect the development neighbourhood teams, on a PCN footprint, to support adults and children with complex health needs.
- Minor changes to Healthy Child, Carers, Domestic Abuse & Green Initiative specs

Alcohol Screening: KPI

Practices will be required to provide confirmation that:

- >90% teenager patients aged 13 to 17yrs (inclusive) have been provided an AUDIT questionnaire if they have not completed one within the past 5 years.
- 2 >90% adult patients aged 18yrs+ have been provided an AUDIT questionnaire if they have not completed one within the past 5 years.
- For both (1) and (2): Please note this will use SystmOne/EMIS reports to measure the 'offering' and not the 'completion' of AUDIT questionnaires, using the 'Alcohol consumption screening' (171208001) code. 'Alcohol consumption screening test declined' (428073005) code is accepted when checking for 'completion' within the past 5 years. Patients who have been (in the past year) referred or under alcohol services are excluded from requiring the offering of screening.
- 3 At least one practice health professional has undertaken training from RISE or completed the following eLearning training and cascaded learning across the practice:

Measured by Self-declaration/provision of Certificate of attendance at training.



Digital and AI: KPIs

Practices will be required to provide confirmation by self-declaration that:

- At least one health professional has explored using AI scribe with at least one patient and has shared experience with practice.
- 2 PCN level discussion of shared experience of using a AI scribe.
- 3 At least 1 receptionist, 1 administrator/manager and 1 clinician in each practice signs up to be an NHS App ambassador
- Practice to engage in a practice based training session on use of the NHS App (provided by the training hub) and provide at least one drop-in session for patients to increase usage of NHS app amongst its patients.
- Practices to provide photos to confirm displaying poster with QR code in front door/window and waiting/reception area to promote NHS England Online registration form and provide screenshot of practice webpage to clarify solely promote the NHS England Online registration form and remove out of date references to GMS1 form /any suggestions that proof of address or ID is essential.
- 6 Practice achieve >60% digital uptake of the NHSE Online Registration form
- Self-declaration to confirm that at least one Pharmacy First referral has been made using the TPP SystmOne BARS (Booking and Referral Standard) process.
- Practices to confirm they have setup easy access to the London Care Record from within SystmOne/EMIS and that they have cascaded appropriate training to practice staff to ensure awareness of existence and potential use.



Alcohol Screening in Teenagers and Adults

Alcohol

• JSNA 2023: Ealing has the highest rate of alcohol related hospital admissions in London

• 2021 survey: 40% of pupils said they had ever had an alcoholic drink.

Prevalence increases with age, from 13% of 11-year-olds to 65% of 15-year-olds.

6% of all pupils said they usually drank alcohol at least once per week, same as in 2018.

 Rate of alcohol related mortality in Ealing is 36.8/100,000 (5th highest rate in London)

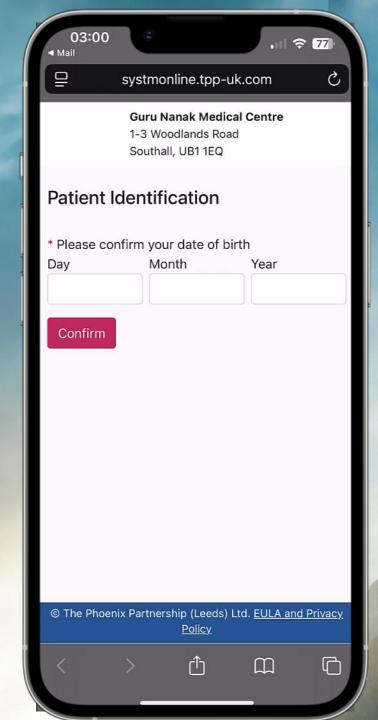
- Offer Alcohol Use Disorder Identification Test (AUDIT) questionnaire (can be via SMS, Email or NHS App messaging) to patients aged 13yrs upwards, who lack any completed AUDIT questionnaire in the past 5 years
- Offer support, brief advice or referral/signposting to services (e.g. RISE) as appropriate following AUDIT responses received
- At least one health professional in practice undertakes any training offered by RISE or eLearning training on Alcohol intervention and brief advice and cascades learning to others (www.e-lfh.org.uk/programmes/alcohol/)

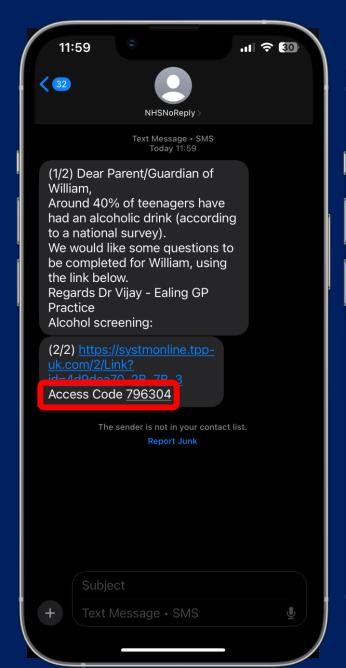


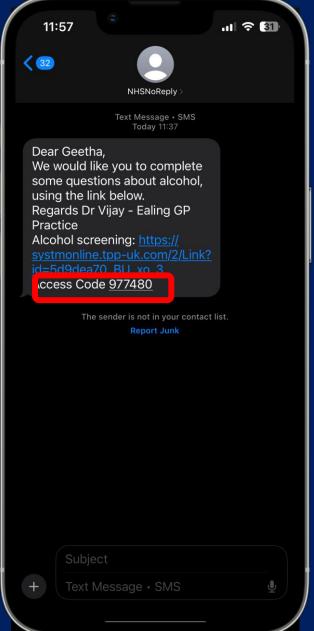


Remove Access Code for Questionnaires / Patient Replies

Practices are requested to remove the Access code option to increase response rates for questionnaires & patient replies.

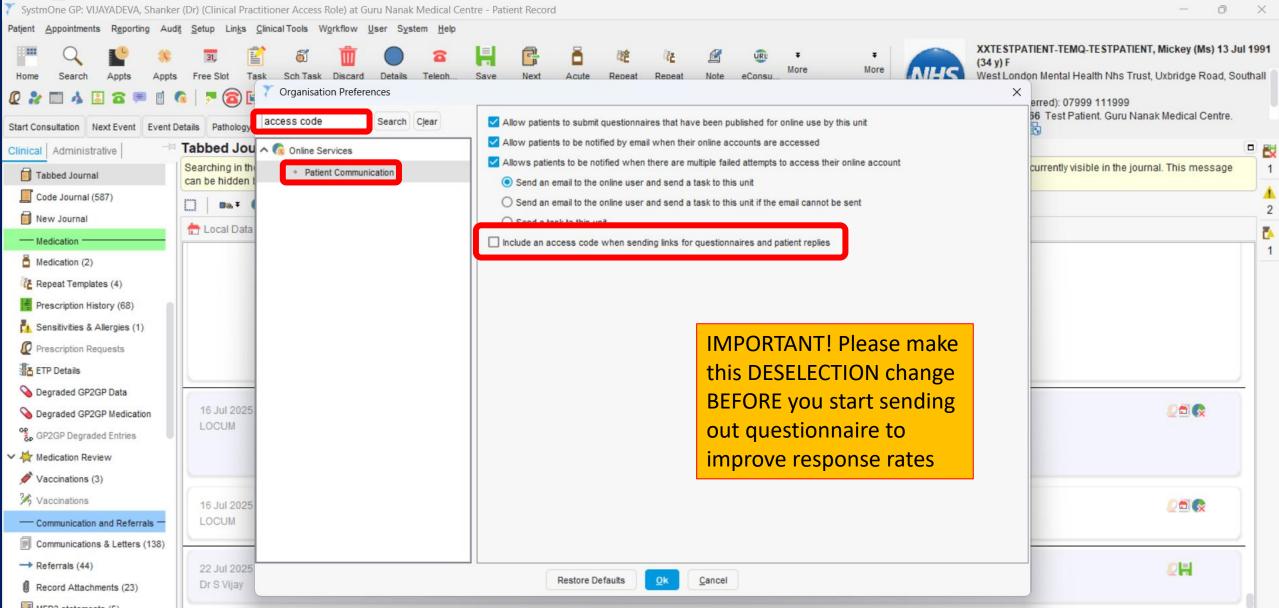
Patients still have to enter their Date of Birth (as verification) and the Access code does not offer additional security as SystmOne includes the Access code in the same message as the original link.

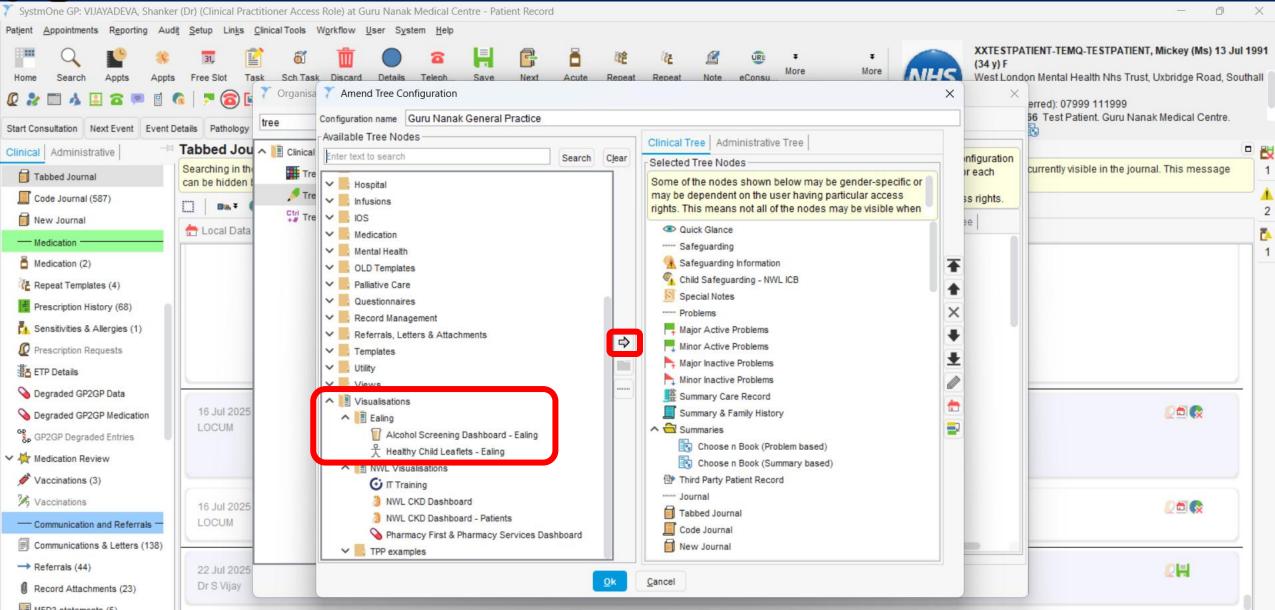

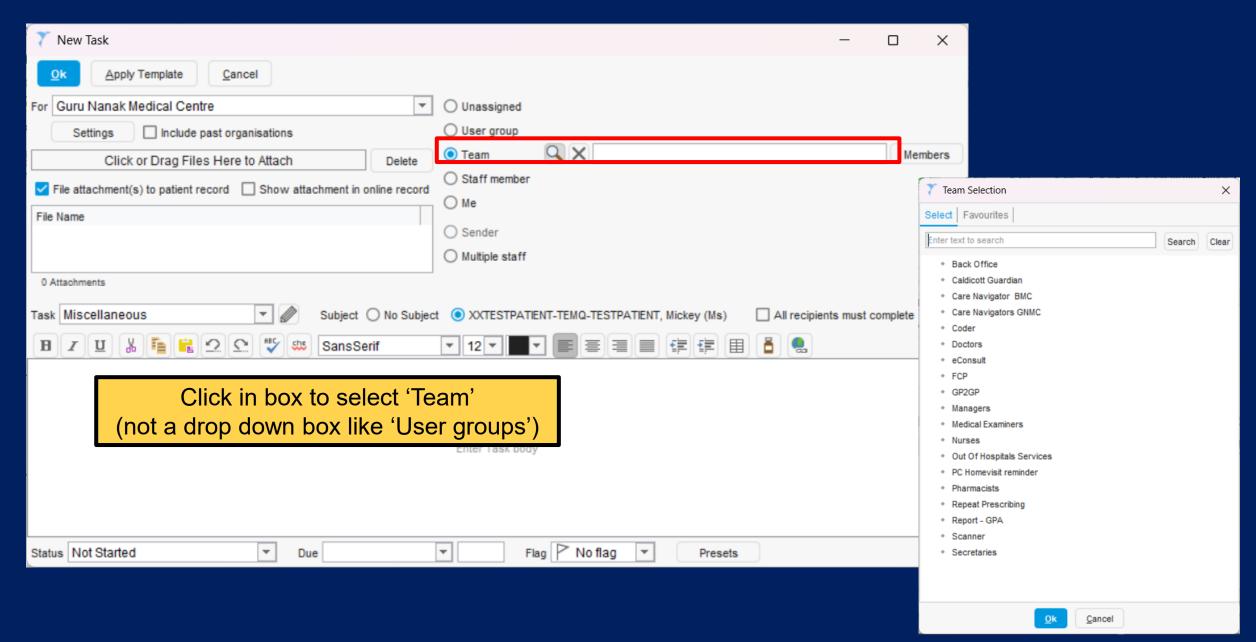


Current use of 'User group' – e.g. when sending a Task





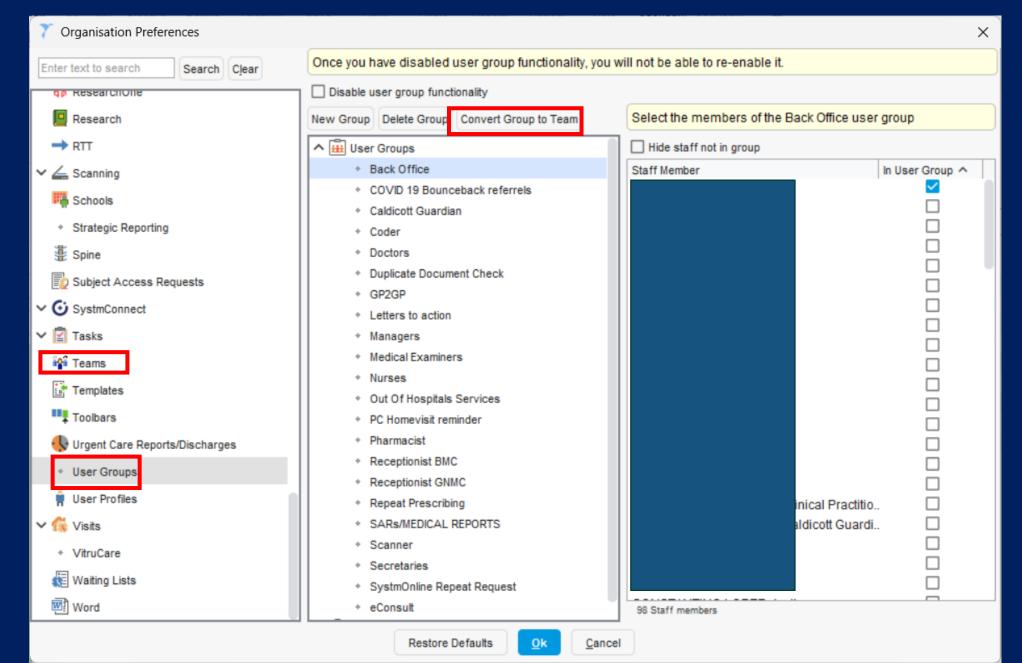
New use of 'Team' to replace 'User group'— e.g. when sending a Task



- Why do we need to change from SystmOne 'User groups' to SystmOne 'Teams'?
 - In 2021/22, SystmOne stated that 'User groups' are being replaced by 'Teams' and practices need to switch
 - Do not confuse SystmOne 'Teams' with Microsoft 'Teams' they are different!
 - Newer SystmOne functionality can only use 'Team' and not 'User group':
 - e.g. Communications Annexe (to send messages to patients) can only receive replies to a 'Team' and not 'User group';
 - SystmConnect (if wish to explore online consultations within SystmOne) can only use 'Team'
 - 'Teams' are easier to maintain than 'User groups' (e.g. easier to rename) and help with hierarchy of Teams
 - 5 To help staff with the switchover, consider **keeping the names of 'Teams' the same as previous names of 'User groups'**, but you might wish to rename them in future
 - May be some initial frustrations (e.g. notifications) that need to be tackled after switching

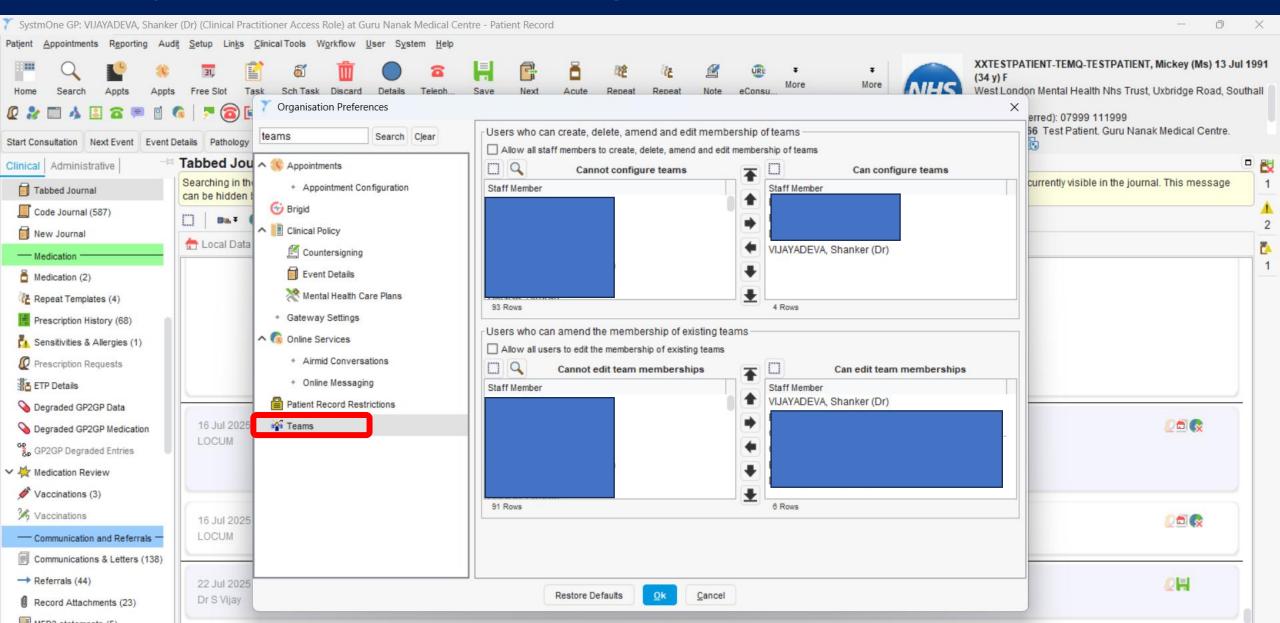


Organisational Preferences -> User Groups -> Convert Group to Team



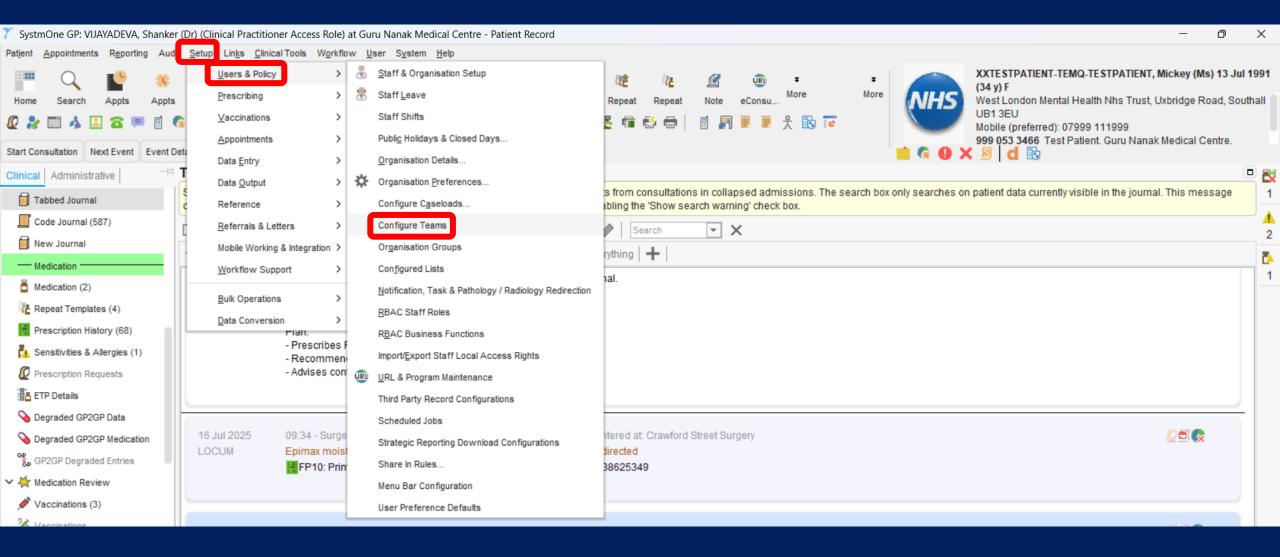

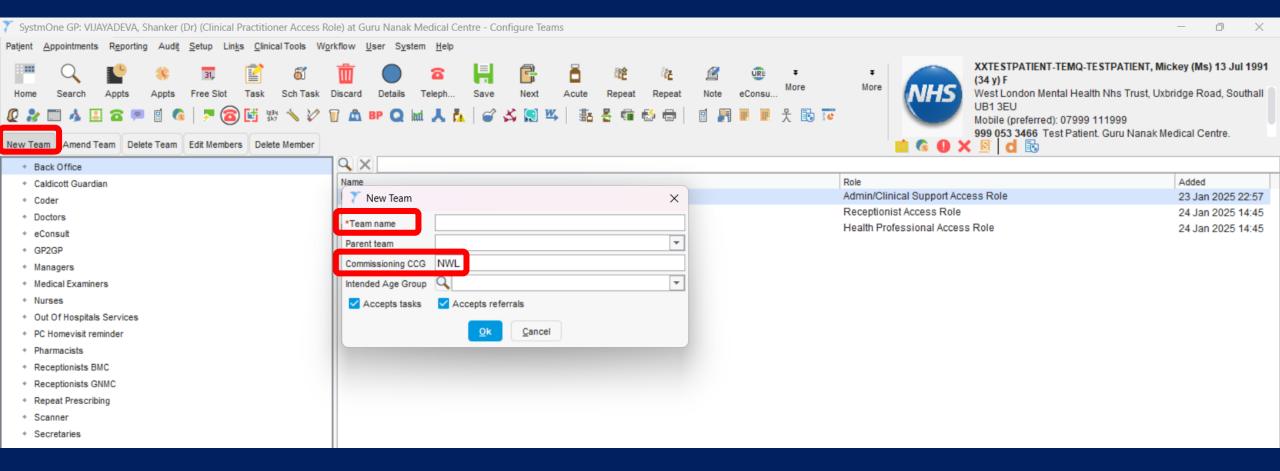

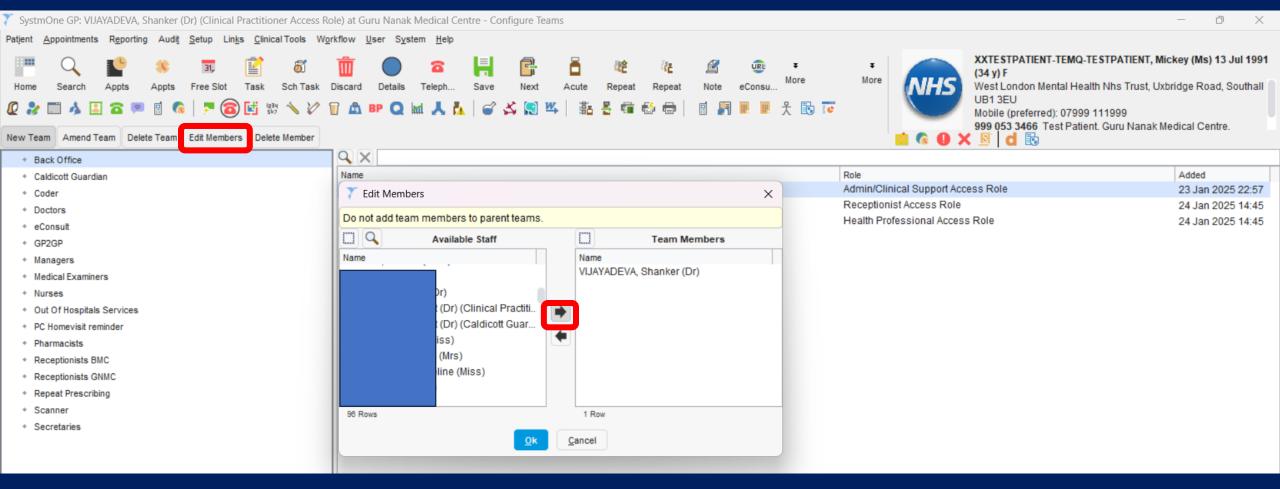

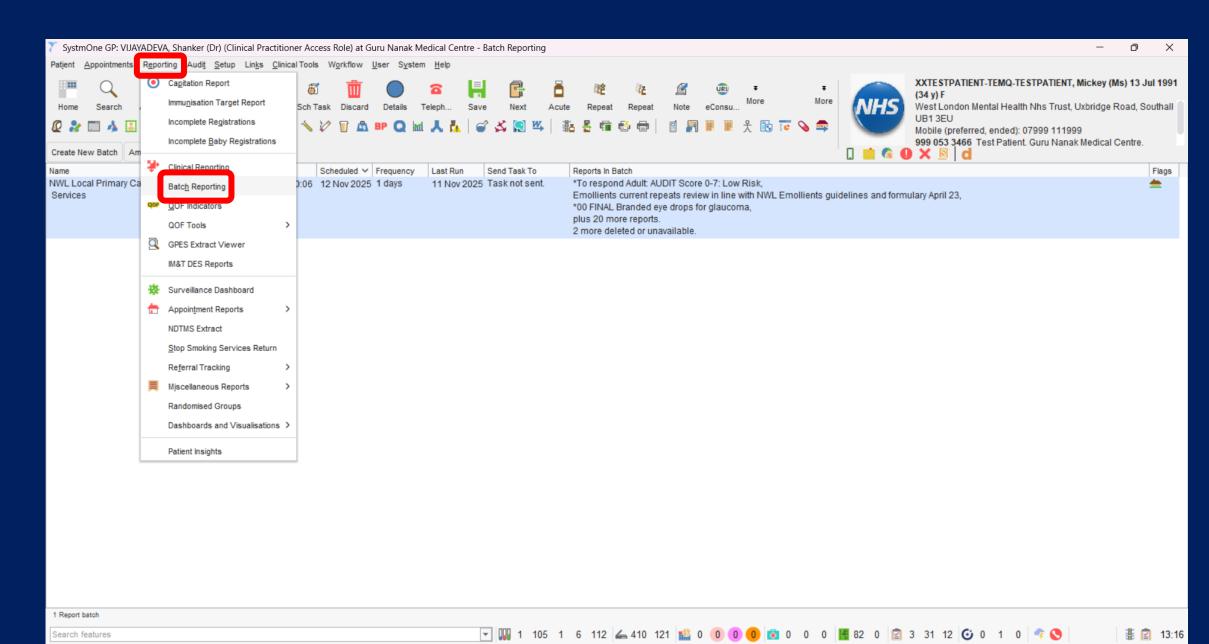

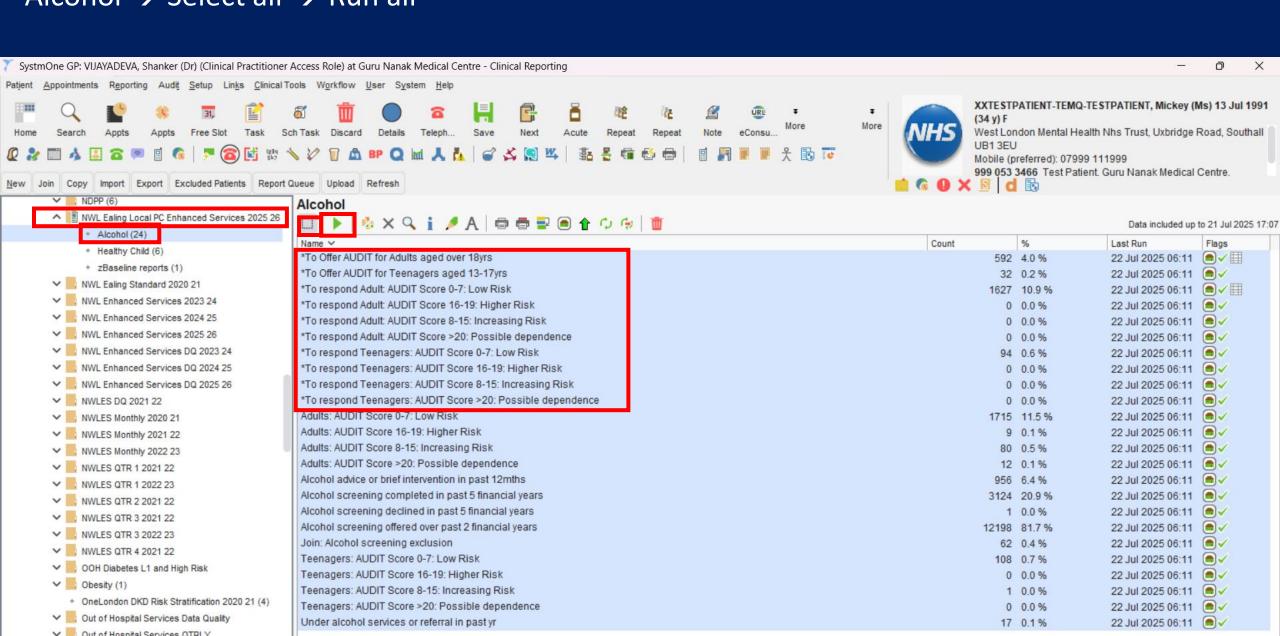
Checklist of Suggested Steps:

- The convert 'User Group' to 'Team' → Initially keep names & members the same to help with changeover/familiarity (?best to due when practice close/quiet)
 - → Task rules are updated automatically
- 2 Setup staff members that can configure 'Teams' (and also configure 'Teams' further if required)
- Bulk update Tasks to reassign from 'User Group' to corresponding 'Team':
 - Main issue is it is less obvious to see 'initial date task created/sent' as focus on 'date updated'
- Update any 'Task templates' setup to send to User groups
- 5 Update any 'Batch reporting' setup to send Tasks to User groups
- 6 Delete all remaing User groups once Teams set up done, to avoid staff confusion
- 7 No need to rush to 'Disable user group functionality' via Organisational Preferences
- 8 Alert all practice staff to check & update their User preferences to switch from User group to Team
- RISK/ISSUE: Scheduled Tasks may still be sent to original User group (even if deleted), so keep an eye on global Task inbox

This guidance outlines key considerations for NHS technology leaders implementing ambient scribing products across health and care settings in England.

Ambient scribing products, when combined with generative Artificial Intelligence (AI), can convert speech directly into structured medical documentation, such as notes and letters.

The products are sometimes referred to as ambient scribes or AI scribes and include advanced ambient voice technologies (AVTs) used for clinical or patient documentation and workflow support.

Priority Notification: Ensuring Safe and Assured Adoption of Al Scribe Technology

The adoption of ambient scribing products and Ambient Voice Technology (AVT) solutions hold transformative potential for any care setting. Their adoption, when used safely and securely, is to be encouraged to improve both the quality of patient care and operational efficiency. However, since NHS England published AVT guidance on 27th April 2025, we have received an increasing number of requests to clarify their deployment and use.

We are now aware of a number of AVT solutions which, despite being non-compliant with our published guidance, are still being widely used in clinical practice as free trials or through direct commissioning, both by individuals and organisations. Irrespective of care setting, all NHS organisations must ensure that any AVT solutions being used meets the specified NHS standards as the use of non-compliant solutions poses a risk to clinical safety and data security.

Key points you need to follow:

- 1. Do not use AVT solutions that are not compliant with NHS standards.
- 2. All AVT solutions that generate summarisation require, at least, MHRA Class 1 medical device status.
- Providers need to complete a clinical safety risk assessment and data protection impact assessment (DPIA) before using these tools as part of your legal responsibilities as set out in the <u>DCB0160</u>.
- Liability for using a non-compliant solutions sits with the deploying organisation (e.g. general practice
 or trust) or individual user.

A full breakdown of the assurance requirements is detailed below. It is essential that any NHS organisation reads the guidance (https://timurl.com/7s3vmtw2) and checks with their ICB digital team before proceeding.

Several AVT suppliers are approaching NHS organisations, including Primary and Secondary Care, offering Aldriven ambient scribe solutions. While the opportunity for efficiency and workflow enhancement is emerging at pace, many of these vendors have not complied with basic NHS governance standards, such as seeking ICB approval, providing MHRA clinical safety and technical/cyber platform assurance, and evidencing proven benefit within the NHS.

Proceeding with non-compliant solutions risks clinical safety, data protection breaches, financial exposure, and fragmentation of broader NHS digital strategy. It is requirement to check that your AVT solution meets the requirements below. Liability for the use of non-compliant AVT solutions will be held by the local NHS Trust, Primary Care practice or individual clinicians.

An NHS England national delivery proposal is in development to support all care settings to roll out assured and standardised AVT solutions across England in a safe and compliant way to deliver efficiency and productivity benefits across the system. This will include a common and consistent approach to documentation and broader assurance requirements. Further communications will be issued shortly outlining more information on this work.

NHS position on AVT deployment

NHS England has published guidance on how digital technologies should be approved for use in the NHS. Additional National Guidance explains how AVT solutions should be selected, deployed, and scaled. These standards are required for any AVT solution to be considered safe, effective, and eligible for NHS adoption (https://lingurl.com/7s/zmrtlv2).

Minimum Requirements for AVT adoption

It is the responsibility of all NHS organisations to ensure that AVT suppliers demonstrate compliance with the requirements listed below. Any engagement with AVT suppliers that are not compliant must cease until such time as compliance has been formally signed off by the ICB. Local and regional governance oversight should be followed as standard. This applies to any health and care organisation or professional.

It is the responsibility of all AVT suppliers to demonstrate compliance with these requirements.

1. Core platform assurance requirements

- Digital Technology Assessment Criteria (DTAC), Data Security and Protection Toolkit (DSPT,)
 Cyber Essentials Plus, CREST-approved pen testing
- Data Protection Requirements as set by ICO Local ICB / Trust governance approval including DPIA completion
- c. Clinical Safety Officer(s) named and accountable
- d. End-to-end encryption and GDPR compliance
- e. No unsafe functionality e.g. prompt injection access
- Appropriate NHS clinical system integration (API or FHIR/HL7 compliance and write-back capability).
- g. The responsibility for translation accuracy remains with the AVT supplier.

2. Enhanced Requirements

- a. Medical Device Classification All AVT solutions that undertake summarisation require, at least, MHRA Class 1 medical device status. Companies must NOT extend system capabilities to produce generative diagnoses, management plans, or other medical referrals and calculations without seeking at least MHRA Class 2a approval.
- b. Data Protection Safeguarding Patient Information is paramount. Patient data from clinical sessions (e.g. immediate inference) should be automatically deleted unless legally or operationally required, in line with UK GDPR and DPA 2018 principles on data minimisation and storage limitation. Further guidance on this will be published shortfy.
- c. System integration Ensure appropriate integration with your IT infrastructure, systems and workflows. For example, in most general practice and hospital settings, AVT solutions will require integration with the principal electronic record system. This will enable automated workflow (e.g. diagnostic test requesting or prescribing presented within the system being used, for clinician validation and submission).

3. Clinical and Operational Benefits Thresholds

Evidence of real-world clinical validation of benefits in the NHS care setting proposed (e.g.
enhancing clinical efficiency and workflow, reducing administrative burden; improving patient
care by increasing face to face time with patients; improving accuracy of documentation;

- improving data quality and capture of structured data recorded in electronic patient record systems.
- Clear economic justification and workforce impact.

Immediate Required actions

- Pause, reject or stop engagement with any AVT supplier that is not able to meet the published assurance
 etendarde shows.
- Pause or stop any implementation or use of AVT by an organisation / individual that is not able to meet the published assurance standards above.
- 3. Engage with your ICB and regional teams for assurance.

- Written by the assigned CSO as part of the overarching Clinical Safety Case (made up of CSCR plus HL, artefacts and evidence)
- Includes scope, executive summary, overview of hazards with severity and likelihood of main risks,
- Agreed and peer reviewed by clinical safety team and programme clinical safety engineer
- Reviewed at an agreed time prior to GO LIVE of service, product or feature.
- . Is a LIVE document

DCB Standards

- DCB0129 Applicable to supplier/developer of service, product or features
- DCB0160 -Applicable deploying organisation

CSO

- . CSO is assigned to write the safety case
- Authoring CSO decides which standard is relevant for the organisation as the content forms the basis of the Hazard Log

Post Deploymen Sign Off to GO LIVE Clinical Safety Report Hazard Log- Live Document DCB Standards Clinical Safety Officer;CSO

Post Deployment Assurance

- Testing and iterating the service or process in live environment

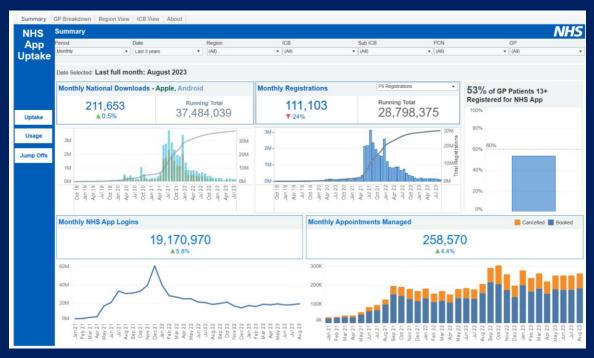

- Useful for communicating with potential new patients
- SMS platform might not be able to send to unregistered patient's phone numbers, but still useful for existing patients (e.g. texting parents to inform them how to register their new baby)
- Short URL: Consider creating a Short URL version of your registration link which makes it shorter and easier to share. There are many websites (e.g. bitly.com) that can help do this for you and they often require you to 'paste' the normal registration link into their webpage to create a 'proxy' Short URL which redirects to the original URL.



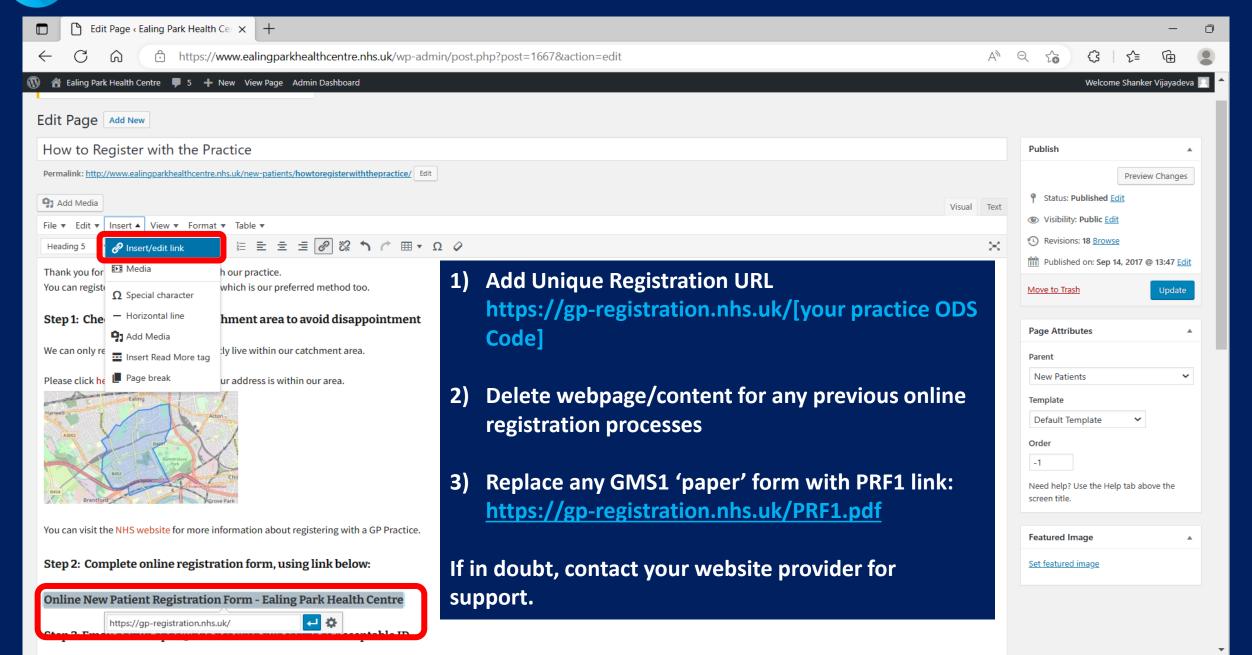

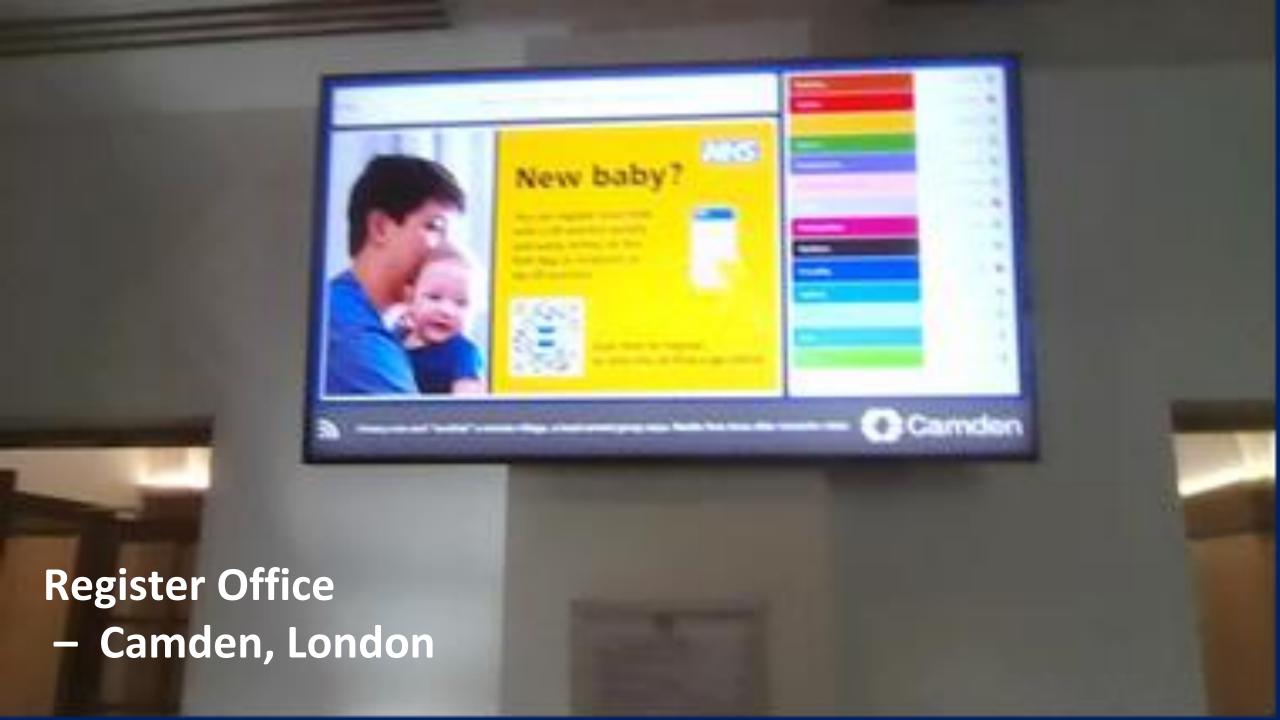
