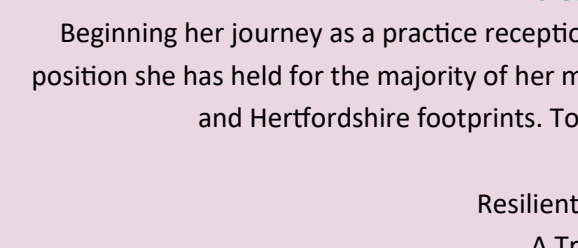

Last call : Training | Expressions of interest for PG Cert in Clinical Education

What is a PG Cert in Education?

The Post Graduate Certificate in Education is a yearlong course in a university and is all about learning how to teach, supervise, assess and evaluate within a Clinical setting. For example, you may want to become or already are a Nurse Education Lead in your PCN. This course will give you an excellent foundation to develop your skills and knowledge and enable you to further your educational career.

Who is the Training for?

The funding is aimed at General Practice Nurses who want to become involved in the Education and Training of others in the clinical setting.

When does the course start and What is the time commitment?

The courses start in September and last a full academic year. You will probably need to take a day out of work a week to complete this course during University term times. You will also need to allow time at weekends etc to complete assignments.

Training | QSIR: Practitioner – Free Places Available

Ready to turn ideas for improvement into action? The QSIR Practitioner programme will equip you with practical tools to plan and lead improvement projects, engage others, use data effectively and test changes that make a meaningful difference to services and patient care. Open to both clinical and non-clinical colleagues.

QSIR: Practitioner is a nationally accredited programme that provides participants with the skills and confidence to undertake grassroots change. It uses a comprehensive, modular curriculum that builds understanding of how to “do” change, including sessions on:

- Leadership: leading improvement projects
- Project management: running improvement projects
- How to sustain and scale improvement projects
- Understanding stakeholders: engaging and working with others
- Understanding and mapping processes
- Using creativity for improvement
- Flow: demand for improvement
- Measurement and capacity

Sessions are fun, interactive and practical, with plenty of top tips and real-life examples. Throughout the programme, participants are encouraged to apply what they’re learning to their own improvement projects, and are supported between workshops to help make those projects a success.

What are the entry requirements?

You need to have studied to degree level in the past to study at a Post Graduate level and you need to be a GPN working in a practice in NWL.

How is it funded?

There is a £5,000 bursary that covers the cost of the course which is paid directly to the university. There is also a bursary of £4,000 which will be provided to your employing practice for supervision and education support (and to possibly cover for when you are not working).

It’s suited to both clinical and non-clinical staff, and although developed by the NHS, it’s open to anyone with an interest in change — including members of the public and the voluntary sector. It runs alongside the health equity “Deep End” scheme, with a strong focus on creating healthier places and fairer systems. There are no fees, but places are limited and the course is usually oversubscribed.

Training | Clinical Supervision Training for GP Nurses

Do you want to train to be a Clinical Supervisor and be paid to run Clinical Supervision Sessions?

We surveyed several senior nurses in primary care in NWL to ask what was missing / what did we need to do more of, to support you all working in practice. Overwhelmingly, they asked for Clinical Supervision.

For GPNs to have clinical supervision sessions, we need CS facilitators — i.e. people to run the sessions. This training will aim to train anyone interested in doing this. The skills you gain from this training will also help with you being able to support other colleagues / trainees elsewhere. Please note the following information:

- If you sign up to this training, you MUST then agree to run sessions approximately 6-8 months of the year, starting in October 2026 and depending on the number of people who train to be a facilitator in your Borough.

- The sessions would be monthly and online, and you would be paid £50 per session (each session would be an hour and probably during a lunchtime).

- Alison, who is running the training sessions, will also try to attend your first session to help / support / guide you through this.

- 2-3 people per Borough will be able to access this training and then they will share the running of the sessions in their Borough going forwards.
